

Copy of response letter from Anthony McGann to Fintan Murphy dated September 4th 2018, after Murphy, as County Registrar, threatened eviction “within two months”. This letter advises that ‘a forensic examination’ of the case was ongoing and any attempt by Murphy to force an eviction would constitute “a serious miscarriage of justice”. The McGanns would then have to ‘take legal action’ against Murphy. This warning was contemptuously ignored by Murphy who pressed ahead regardless with the prolonged unlawful fraud against the McGanns.

Dear Mr Murphy,

I am just in receipt of your letter dated the 27th August 2018. This is the first notification I have had of Court Order 2079/2018. I would be obliged if you can forward me a copy please.

Registrar I fully understand your position regarding the delicate nature of cases like this put before you. However the true facts have to be ascertained relating to my case.

Registrar I refer to previous correspondence to you that this case involving KBC Bank is at present under forensic scrutiny. I therefore put you on Notice that if you execute any possession of our family dwelling and lands we would be left with no alternative than to take action against you. We reserve the right to show this notification to the Court.

We sincerely hope Registrar you will take this in to account. We have always kept you fully informed of the progress appertaining to this case and intend to in the future.

To take such serious action would be a serious miscarriage of justice.

KBC are refusing to answer relevant questions put to them, it has taken them approximately 56 days to reply to our last letter to them, and that letter was just a standard letter and did not remotely give answers to our questions. We have to question why? Innocent people are suffering dreadfully by wrong actions by the Bank.
